



PRIVACY POLICY

Introduction

This website (the “Site”) is owned and operated by Confianza, Inc. (“we” or “us”). We are committed to protecting the privacy of our visitors while they interact with the content and material on this Site. This Privacy Policy sets out how we use and protect any information that you give us when you visit this Site, in online or offline business interactions, or in any other business communications. This Privacy Policy applies to this Site only. It does not apply to other websites to which we link. How Do We Use the Information That You Provide to Us?

- To carry out, monitor and analyze our business and the operation of this Site.

Do We Disclose Any Information to Outside Parties?

We do not sell, trade, or otherwise transfer your personal information to any outside parties except under very limited circumstances. What Are Cookies?

A cookie is a very small text document, which often includes an anonymous unique identifier.
